A LIBERAL VICTORY IN VANCOUVER, B.C.

The Tory Minister of Public Works is De-feated.

Vancouver, B.C., Feb. 28.—British Columbia, which the Conservatives have regarded as their own peculiar stamping ground since 1911, served stern notice on Premier Bowser Saturday. Hon. Charles Tisdall, Minister of Public Works in the newly-constructed Cabinet, was defeated in Vancouver city by a majority of 4,571, while Hon. Lorne Campbell, the newly-appointed Minister of Mines, was elected in Rossland in a three-cornered contest by a plurality of only nine. The Socialist candidate in this contest secured twelve votes, so that the Minister won the support of less than half the electors. Hon. A. C. Flumerfelt, Minister of Finance, will be the candidate in Victoria next Saturday against H. C. Brewster, Provincial Liberal leader.
