PREMIER BORDEN PROMISED TO CONSIDER MATTER

After Hearing Deputation Which In-Cluded Mayor Richardson At Ottawa On Wednesday-Question To

Be Taken Up After the War. That the matter would receive careful consideration by the Dominion Government and that the rights of the people would be preserved, was the reply that Premier Borden made to the deputation which waited upon him in Ottawa, on Wednesday, relative to chean power for Eastern relative to cheap power for Eastern Ontario. Mayor Richardson was a member of the deputation. Premier Borden pointed out how-

ever, that the war was at present taking up the attention of his Government, and that as soon as the war was ever the matter would receive attention. He himself was not acquainted with the facts regarding

The deputation urged that Eastern Ontario be given the opportunity now enjoyed by Western Ontario, in the matter of power from the Hydro-Electric Commissioner for the farm, factory, and fransportation.
