Was Wounded in Shoulder-Now Attached to the 146th Battalion.


Lieut, Frank Strachan, son of Archibald Strachan, Collector of Customs, arrived back in the city on Wednesday afternoon from England after having been at the front for some time and until invalided to England with a bullet in his right shoulder. Pte. Strachan was in the hardware business at Moose Jaw when the war broke out and immediately emlisted with the 11th Battalion of the First Contingent. He transferred in France to the 5th and again to the 1st Battalion. On June 5th last he was wounded in the right shoulder and sent back to England. After being examined by three medical boards and a personal examination was made by Col. A. E. Ross, A. D. M. S., it was decided that the bullet should be allowed to remain as an operation just now would cause serious injury to the shoulder.
