England's Oldest Borough,

As Salisbury is well known as Sarum, so is England's oldest borough, Barnstaple, as Barum, which may have been the Roman name of the town. According to old memorials, "the old name of the town was Abertawe, because it stood towards the mouth of Taw River." The Saxons changed it to Berndenstaple: Barnstaple appears to have been represented in the Witenagemot or Auglo-Saxon Parliament. Thus it is one of the oldest boroughs-if not absolutely the oldest-in the kingdom. Its broadcloth manufacture. once an important industry, has now died out, but there are manufacturers of lace and gloves, large cabinet works, tanneries, and potteries ("Barum ware").
