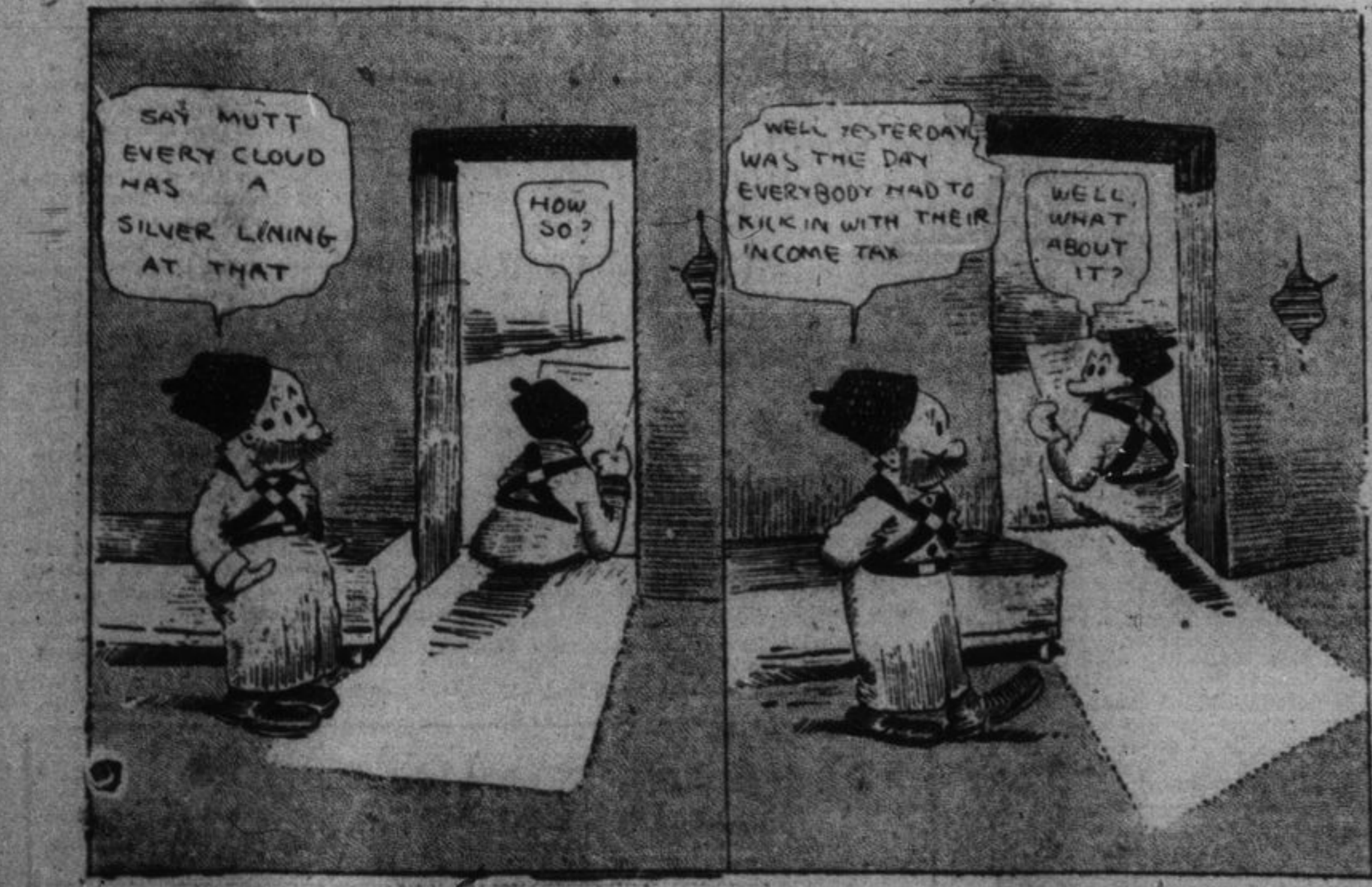

TRYING TO DESTROY CITY

That There Is No Hope of Capturing.

GERMANS ARE BENT

UPON WRECKING THEIR VENGEANCE UPON VERDUN.

But There Will Be Other and More Pressing Work For the Huns in the Near Future.

Paris, March 29.—Telegraphing to the Temps under yesterday's date a correspondent says: "For three days Verdun has been receiving a constant hail of incendiary bombs in the residence and business quarters. This morning I walked through the main business street and saw the useless destruction that is being wrought systematically by the German long range cannon. Soldiers under the direction of the veteran city fire chief are trying to save the city, but while fighting one fire other shells start new blazes.

8,000,000 ACRES LESS FARMED

Mobilization of Agriculturists Causes Decrease in Cultivation.

Paris, March 30.—The mobilization of farmers has caused a decrease in cultivation in France of 3,394,000 hectares (8,386,959 acres), according to a statement made by Jules Melite, Minister of Agriculture, in the Chamber of Deputies to-day.

EXPECT TO STOP RAIDS

Britain Is To Have Superior Aeroplanes.

AN ACCUSATION MADE

THAT PUBLIC INTEREST WAS SACRIFICED.

The Zeppelin Casualties in Britain Total 150 Dead, 150 Wounded, and 103 Missing.

London, March 29.—The Government was again heckled in the House of Commons last night on the inefficiency of the British aircraft service and defence against Zeppelins which were outclassed hopelessly by German machines. Mr. Pemberton-Billing asserted German aeroplanes were immensely superior to British machines, notwithstanding the fact that within twenty miles of London there could be obtained engines better than those used by the Germans.

CONFESSES \$150,000 THEFT.

Arrest Of Notorious Train Robbers Expected As Result.

Grand Rapids, Mich., March 30.—Realizing that he has only a few months to live before a chronic ailment will end his career, "Dick" Harrison, arrested here on a charge of being an accomplice to the gang which robbed a train some time ago at Staunton, W. Va., of \$150,000, has made a full confession. He admitted he was the brains of the organization and is said to have given information which will lead to the arrest of the greatest gang of train robbers since the days of Jesse James.
