Is there an American or a civilized and humane man of any nationality who can grasp the picture of those apparently doomed people more women and children than men among them-sitting on the deck of that wrecked and sinking ship through the long hours of that terrible night, without sharing in his own mind the indignation which they felt against the nation which had brought this fate upon them? there an American who can wish that his own country shall longer extend the hand of friendship to power capable of such ruthless and wanton cruelty? If we Americans can do nothing else, we can, at least, refuse longer to recognize the author of this act among the civilized governments of the world and to admit it, in our thought and speech and diplomatic relations, to a plane of equality with ourselves and with other nations which preserve some standards of humanity and of honor.

It is merely dodging the issue to tell ourselves that we have no positive evidence that a German submarine did this work. We have much better evidence than we ever had that the Maine was blown up by a Spanish mine. There may be enough lack of evidence to plead as a timfd excuse for non-action, if the government wishes to continue the humiliating role which it has been playing for the last year; but if evidence to justify action is sought, we have it in plenty, and all the world knows we have it. The head of smut which is found in the straw has displaced the grain which would have been produced had it not been for the disease. Hence, if the crop showed ten per cent of smut, there would be a decrease of ten per cent in the yield of grain, which would be a loss of six bushels per acre, when the yield would be 60 bushels per acre under normal conditions. Estimating the loss at ten per cent. is, if anything a little below the average, and we may safely say that many oat growers have experienced a very much greater loss.

Nature Of the Disease.

The different kinds of smuts are, -loose smut of oats, the most common and most prevalent smut in Ontario; the stinking smut or bunt of wheat, covered smut of barley, loose smut of wheat and loose smut of barley. The three first mentioned are cantrolled by treating with formalin or bluestone, while the last two cannot; and can, only be controlled by hot water treatment. We will discuss chiefly those that can be controlled by treating with formalin. The smuts are fungous diseases,

the outside of the grain it can be destroyed by a fungicide, but in the case of the loose smuts of wheat and barley, the threads or roots of the fungous penetrate the grain itself, and will remain there until grain is sown, when it will start growth when the grain germinates. Hence any application of a fungicide which does not penetrate the seed would not kill these two fungous diseases. This is a brief account of the life

history of grain smuts. The treating with several chemical fungicides has been tried by Experiment Stations throughout the Dominion. Such chemicals as copper sulphate or bluestone, potassium sulphate and formalin. The former has been used a great deal, but seed and consequently the plant. 
