RICHARD MCKEEVER OF TIGHBORNE KILLED.

He Was With the Canadian Mounted Rifles at the Front.

Richard McKeever, of Tighborne Junction, who enlisted about a year ago in the Mounted Rifles at Deloraine, Manitoba, was killed in action, according to a message just received.

He was one of the finest built men who ever left Frontenac county, and had been doing splendid work at the front. He is survived by his father, William McKeever, who runs a saw-mill at Tighborne, one brother, William, in Manitoba, and two sisters, one at home, and Mrs. Kennedy, near the village. Deceased was born at Tighborne, and, except for a few years spent with his brother in the west, had always lived in the county.

Report of Inspector W. H. Wylie for month of March.

At a meeting of the Children's Aid Society on Tuesday, Inspector W. H. Wylie submitted the following report:

Applications for children, 10; children brought to shelter (not wards), 15; placed on parole (not wards), 3; returned to parents (not wards), 10; involved during the month, 95; made wards, 3; sent to the Industrial School, 2; complaints received, 25; investigations, 28; office interviews, 65; places visited outside the city, 15; wards in foster homes heard from, 10; wards placed out, 2; wards returned to shelter, 1; wards visited, 2; warnings given, 15.
