THE BOARD OF WORKS

TO PUT TARVIA ON ALL ROADS TREATED BEFORE.

Cabmen On Clarence Street To Be Asked Not To Stand In Front Of F. W. Cooke's Store—Walk and Crossings For Victoria Street.

The Board of Works yesterday afternoon decided to put tarvia this year on streets that have been treated during the past two years, and to do it under the local improvement plan. The tarvia will be secured at the same rate as last year.

F. W. Cooke, again wrote the Board asking that it take steps to stop cabs from standing in front of his place of business on Clarence street and creating a nuisance. His landlord, J. R. Henderson, made a similar request. The matter was referred to the chairman to try and have the hackmen keep clear of the space in front of Mr. Cooke's store. If the hackmen refuse, the Board will amend the by-law to afford relief to Mr. Cooke.

Isaac Allen asked for a concrete walk and two asphalt crossings on the south side of Victoria street between Earl and Union streets, as he intends erecting several houses in that block this year. The request was referred to the chairman and the city engineer with power to act.

A statement was submitted by the city engineer showing that the stock of the engineering department was worth \$6,538.

A. Malone, 402 Johnston street, wrote protesting against having to pay street watering tax when no watering of the roadway was done. He asked for a refund. The matter was referred to the city engineer.

The chairman announced that nothing further had been heard from the Dominion Public Works Department with regard to establishing a new harbor line.

It was decided to call for tenders for 75 tons of hard coal and 50 tons of soft coal for the asphalt plant.

The chairman stated that it would be necessary to erect a structure in the fair grounds to store the new road asphalt plant.

The City Property Committee will be asked to give the Board the use of the old agricultural building in the fair grounds for the storage of its equipment.

The Board decided at the expiration of this year to cease renting the vacant lot at the corner of William and Ontario streets for storage purposes. One hundred dollars a year is asked for the use of this lot.

The Utilities Commission will be asked to extend its electrical line to the fair grounds to supply power for the asphalt plant.

In attendance at the meeting were Alds. Peters, (Chairman), Couper, Hughes, Litton and Wormwith.

LOCOMOTIVE PLANT BUSY.

Have Orders Ahead For At Least a Year.

Four shares of Canadian Locomotive, bought at 59 1/2 on Monday, sold on the Toronto Stock Exchange Tuesday at 60 1/2, with 63 asked and 61 1/2 bid.

In some quarters a three to five point advance would not be considered surprising.

Emilius Jarvis, the president of the company, told a press representative that there was no new development at the Kingston works which would lend any warrant for a boom in the stock at the present time.

"Any influences that would move the market for the stock now might just as well have done so several months ago. The company has orders on hand that will keep the plant working at capacity for at least a year. And the outlook for new orders is particularly bright."

"We are now turning out fifteen new locomotives a month—this in addition to our work on munitions. The one difficulty we are experiencing at the present time is that of securing materials. These are very scarce, with consequent high prices obtaining."

VERY STRICT ATTENTION

Paid to Speed of Autos, Motorcycles and Bicycles.

ASSESSOR'S CENSUS.

Of Children In City Between The Ages Of Eight And Fourteen.

The following is a complete report submitted to the Board of Education by the Secretary, John Macdonald, regarding the assessor's census:

"I beg leave to report that the assessor's census of children in the city between the ages of eight and fourteen years, was compared with the enrollment of the different schools with gratifying results.

"We secured from each teacher, her class enrollment and then compared the lists with the rolls. The names of the children who were not accounted for were sent to the different separate School teachers, and they marked off those who were among their pupils. This left a residue of 34 children, whose homes were visited by Andrew Lanigan and full particulars obtained regarding their apparent absence from school. In many instances the pupils were known by two Christian names, in others by two surnames and in others change of residence was responsible for the lack of information. When the sifting process was completed, we were enabled to account for every pupil whose name appears on the assessor's rolls for 1915. This result is not only gratifying but exceptional.

"We discovered one blind boy, one boy nearly blind, one deaf boy, one invalid boy and one invalid girl. The three former have been reported to the Children's Aid Inspector in accordance with the Departmental Regulations.

"I may say that the foregoing excellent results were in a great measure due to the services rendered by Mr. Lanigan. In many cases homes had to be visited three and four times in order to secure the desired information."

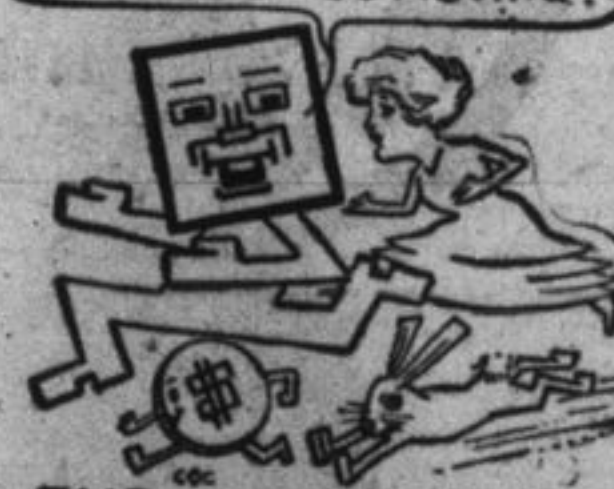
