

WIDOW OF SHIP BUILDER.

Mrs. Emeline H. Johnson Dies At Clayton Home.

Mrs. Emeline H. Johnson, widow of Simon G. Johnson, one of the most prominent shipbuilders of Clayton, N.Y., and launched during his time over forty lake vessels, died on Friday, after a long illness, aged eighty-

Mrs. Johnson was a daughter of Mr. and Mrs. John Oades, Sackets Harbor, where she was born in 1828, her grandfather, a native of England, being a shipbuilder and having launched at his yards at Sackets Harbor some of the vessels that helped to hold Lake Ontario for the states during the war of 1812, and her father having also been a shipbuilder. He was drowned in the lake at Sackets Harbor, and his widow and her six children, including Emeline, moved to Clayton, when the latter was about twelve years of age. She was married to Mr. Johnson in 1854, living first at Garden Island after her marriage, and later going back to Clayton, where she passed the remainder of her long life. She was the last of a family of six children. Mr. Johnson died August 2nd, 1910.


