(Special to the Whig) London, May 22.—Jeremiah C. Lynch, American citizen, sentenced to ten years imprisonment for participation in the Dublin rebellion, wore the uniform of a rebel officer, Gen. Sir John Maxwell reported to Premier Asquith today. He was first sentenced to death but the sentence was later commuted.
