A UNIQUE INDUSTRY. NEWFOUNDLAND CELEBRATED FOR RIPENING PORT WINE. Mellowing of Fine Wines Has for Many Years Been One of the Profitable Pursuits of the Colony—Portugal Buys Codfish, and Returning Light Brings New Wine to Get Benefit of Island's Climate. NEWFOUNDLAND writer, discussing the probable effects of Prohibition in that island, refers to a little-known fact—that Newfoundland's climate is specially adapted to the "ripening of port wine." He says: "An interesting circumstance, serving as a sidelight on this prohibition problem, is the bearing it will have on the mellowing of port wine, which is one of the romances of the wine industry in the world. Newfoundland's port wine is the finest known to man. Of course, we do not produce the wine; we ripen it. The land of fog and ice and codfish does not admit of the grape being grown; but a scarcely less important factor exists here—our climate possesses some peculiar quality which ripens and matures the raw vintage as this cannot be accomplished anywhere else in the world. There is a large trade between Portugal and Newfoundland in this connection, and Portugal agreed to admit our fish into her markets on the "most favored nation" terms in consideration of Newfoundland reducing by one-half her present customs import duty on port wine. The story of Newfoundland's port through a process of evolution effected 2,000 miles from where it was begun. The crude beverage is brought across the Atlantic from the sunny slopes of Iberia to be mellowed on the bleak coast of Terra Nova. For over two centuries Portugal has been one of the best customers for our codfish, a fleet of sailing vessels carrying shipments of cod there the whole year round. In returning they brought among other things casks of port wine for their owners. For a long time the import was small, as the beverage was merely for local consumption, but by and by it was discovered that the wine from Portugal, after remaining some time here, improved in quality and possessed properties which, in its original condition, were unknown. The hard-drinking Devonian fishers, who ruled supreme in our colony in those days were loud in their satisfaction at the change, and although they were unaware as to whether the transformation was effected by the voyage or by the climate, or by both, they were prompt to avail themselves of the fact, and import still larger quantities. Some bright genius then devised the idea of storing it in cellars for some years and exporting it again for sale, as its enhanced ripeness and bouquet would certainly insure it a ready and extensive market. This practice was gradually adopted, and as the years went by a large demand for it sprang up in England, where it was introduced by the Devonshire fish merchants having branches in Newfoundland. Thence it was exported to the European continent, and in time to the American colonies; though after the Revolutionary War the trade in it with the United States was done by Newfoundland direct, which was also the case with Canada, for in both cases a goodly clientele, with cultivated tastes, had become initiated to the merits of the vintage and learned to appreciate its excellent qualities.
