A BIRTHDAY CAKE.

How to Make One Which is a Real

Weigh seven large eggs (fresh), take their weight in dried flour and a little more than half their weight in sifted sugar. Break the eggs, reparate the yolks from the whites. Beat the former in a bowl, add the sugar to them very gradually, together with a little grated lemon rind, a spoonful of orange flower or rosewater or any other suitable flavoring. Add the flour a little at a time and continue to beat the mixture for twenty minutes. Butter a mold, sprinkle powdered sugar upon the butter, and shake off all that will not adhere. Tie a strip of buttered paper round the top of the mold to keep the preparation from rolling down the sides while it is baked. Pour in the cake, pail filled with cold water. 

Troubles and Failures.
