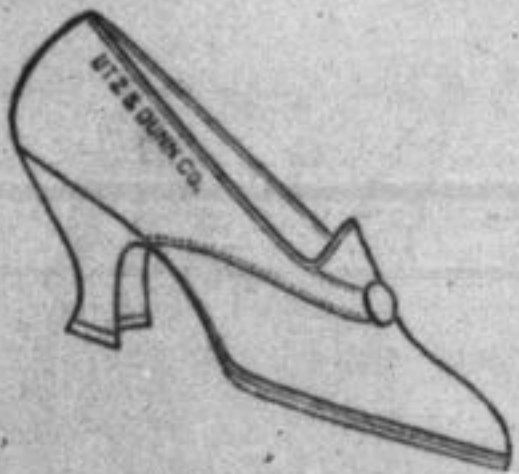

Pte. George Albert Robinson, who left Belleville with the 39th Battalion, was officially reported killed on May 22nd.

Senator Derbyshire, of Brockville, suffered a stroke of paralysis at his residence. His removal to the General Hospital followed where he is reported to be resting comfortably. His right side, including his speech, is affected.

Rev. S. J. Farmer, of the first Baptist Church, Regina, has accepted a call to McPhail Baptist Church in Ottawa. Mr. Farmer is a brother of Messrs. G. B. and C. A. Farmer, of Perth, and Dr. Farmer of McMaster University, Toronto. He will take over his new pastorate early in July.

George Stephens completed 26 years continuous residence at the Central Hotel, Brockville. He went there in 1890 from Kingston to accept the position of night clerk. Mr. Stephens was born in London, England, 76 years ago last December and was a boy chorister at the Duke of Wellington's funeral.

TO GET MILITARY CROSS

Son of Rev. Dr. Hamilton, Brockville, Wins Honor

Brockville, June 5.—Lieut. R. Gordon Hamilton, one of the three oldest sons of Rev. R. M. Hamilton, B. A., minister of the First Presbyterian church, has been recommended for the coveted Military Cross for distinguished conduct while serving on the French front with the Royal Horse Artillery, B.E.F.

Lieut. Gordon Hamilton had his horse killed beside him by a shell and very gallantly carried him off the battlefield, and it is said that the recommendation for the Military Cross is due to this act. The captain survived only twenty minutes.

Thomas G. Wright, Picton, Dead

Picton, June 5.—On Thursday Thomas G. Wright a prominent and respected yeoman of Prince Edward County, residing near Picton passed away. Deceased had occupied positions of trust in municipal and other matters, and at the time of his demise was a director of the Eastern Ontario Dairyman's Association. Mr. Wright was an elder brother of M. Wright, barrister, of Belleville.

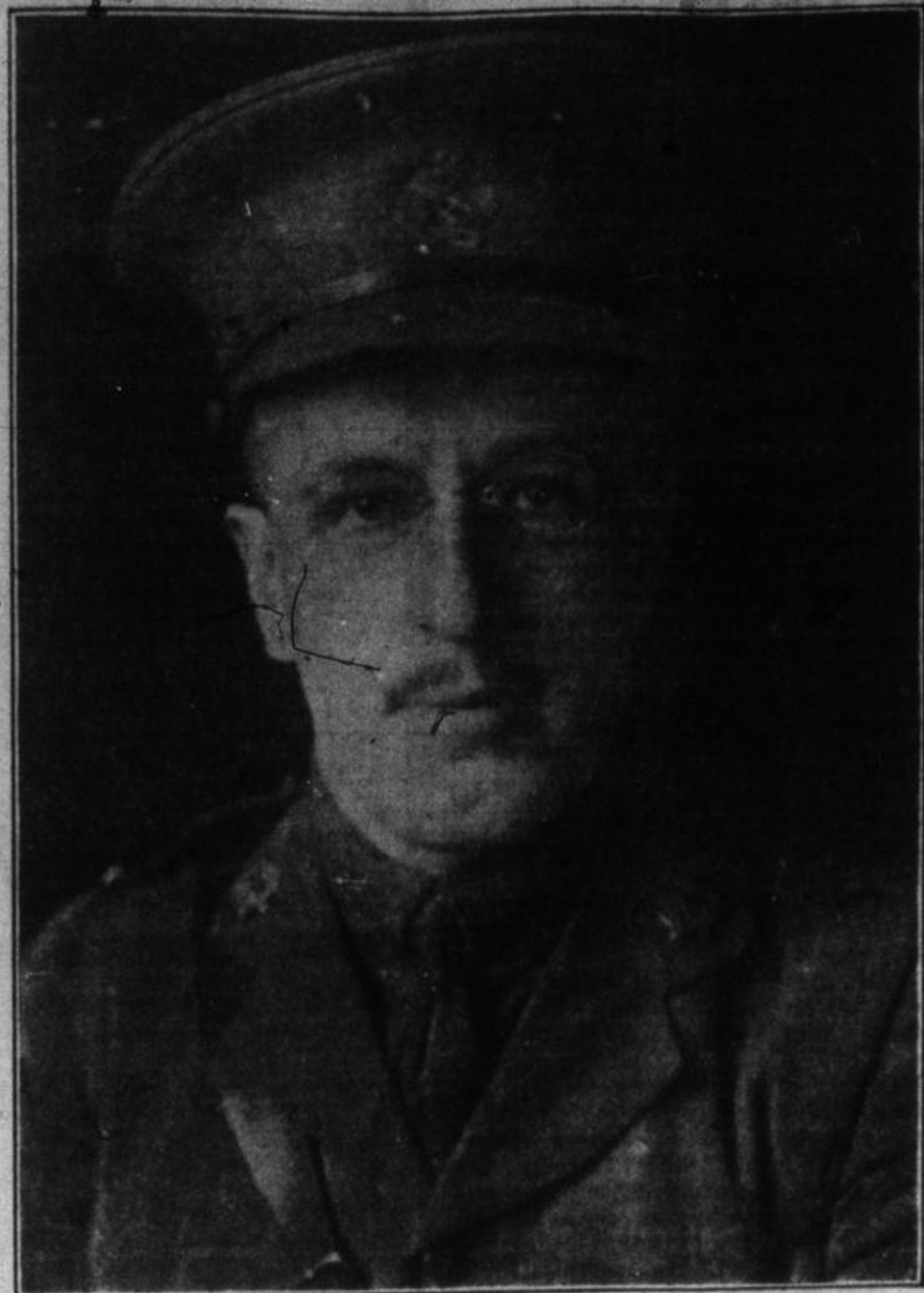

CHURCH STEEPLE STRUCK.

About Twenty Feet of It Was Burned.

Port Hope, June 6.—During the severe thunderstorm on Friday night the spire of the Methodist Church at Newcastle, about fifteen miles west of here, was struck by lightning and about twenty feet of the framework was burned. A call was sent to the Bowmanville fire brigade for assistance, but they were unable to reach there owing to two bridges just west of the village being washed away.

The damage is estimated at about \$1,000.
