PLEADING FOR FOOD, BUT NOT BEGGARS.

The Duty of Canadians To Help the Unfortunate Belgians.
(Special to the Whig.)
New York, June 8.—One shipment of food supplies left an American port for Belgium every day last December, was the announcement made the other day by a Belgian Relief Committee worker, when summarizing the internal conditions of the devastated little country.
"It must be remembered," the worker continued, "that the whole people of northern France and Belgium are not beggars and that they have not accepted gifts until driven to do so. Millions of them are today receiving the food that holds body and soul together from the Belgian Relief Commission. Think what this means. These millions of people are without means of obtaining food except such as is given them. We, who are living in abundance, reaping rewards from war contracts—directly or indirectly—cannot realize the matter to its fullest extent, but we must bring ourselves to appreciate it as much as possible.

"If we on this side of the Atlantic do not send the food that is needed these people will starve. It is our duty to send it. The misfortune that has plunged them into poverty and starvation is the means of bringing money and prosperity into our hands. We must return a part of this to save those mothers and their babes from starvation that is imminent. Shall we let them starve?"
"It is to meet such conditions as those that the Belgian Relief Committee was organized. The work is being carried on carefully and efficiently in New York and by the Canadian Committee at 59 St. Peter St., Montreal. The latter organization has just sent out a new appeal for funds and food for the unfortunate of Belgium and a generous response is expected from Canadians.

A NEW YORK AUCTIONEER Pays a Touching Tribute to Lord Kitchener.
New York, June 8.—A silent but intensely impressive tribute to the memory of Lord Kitchener was paid by a large and representative audience at a theatre in West Forti-fifth street last night. The tribute was spontaneous, and was not anticipated by anyone in the audience.
A film entitled "How Britain prepared" was being exhibited as an object lesson in preparedness. The first part of the picture dealt with the transformation of 5,000,000 recruits into an efficient and well-organized force of fighting men in the brief time of eighteen months.
Suddenly an excellent portrait of the dead Field Marshal was flashed upon the screen. The orchestra leader tapped his baton and as the opening bars of the hymn "Nearer My God to Thee" were heard, the entire audience rose and stood in silence until the strains had died away.

CANADIAN CEMETERY

At Shorncliffe Consecrated by Bishop of Dover.
London, June 8.—Pathetic scenes marked the consecration of the Canadian Garrison Cemetery at Shorncliffe, where the heroes of the Princess Pats and of the 49th and 42nd Regiments are already buried.
The cemetery is three acres in extent and is beautifully situated on a hill overlooking the sea.
Gen. Steele commanded the five Canadian companies. The Bishop of Dover was assisted by Bishop Depeyster of New Westminster and Bishop White of Honan.
Among those present were Col. Steacey, Canadian Director of the Chaplain Service, Maj. Wells, of Prince Rupert's land and Diocese Capt. Buckland, of Quebec.
