Letter From Germany. In acknowledgment of a parcel forwarded to him in Germany by the American consul, Sergt. Claude V. Asling, 15th Canadians, writes from Göttingen camp thanking him for the parcel of March 22nd. He adds, "Life in the camp is not at all bad, and the general health is good. We have weekly concerts and church service. Very little news comes in and consequently we are ignorant of the doings at the front. Quite a many of the sick are going to Switzerland shortly for convalescence." The Six Nations chiefs have sent King George a resolution of condolence on the death of his "great and trusted war chief."

PTE. L. G. KEILL HAS BEEN WOUNDED. Kingston Young Man With Princess Patricias Received Wound In Arm.

Mrs. Bruce Keill 296 Queen street, on Sunday evening received a telegram from the officer in charge of the records that her son, Pte. Lincoln Garfield Keill of the Princess Patricias Infantry, had been wounded in the left arm on June 4th, and had been admitted to No. 3 Stationary Hospital, Wimereux. Pte. Keill is well known in the city. He is a graduate of Queen's University and was a tutor in classics there. He enlisted with the Princess Patricias in May 1915, and left with two other Kingston boys Adrian Revelle and William Milne, who are still in the trenches.
