Was First Red Man To Appear Before Lt.-Col. Hunter on Charge of Desertion.

The first Indian to be charged before Lt.-Col. Hunter with desertion appeared before the county magistrate Monday morning, and was sent to the Central Prison for nine months. His name is Pte. G. A. Brant, and he enlisted at Deseronto last January. He was given month's leave of absence, from May 8th to June 8th, to work with a farm-er. He did not, however, turn up at the end of his furlough, and was arrested at Deseronto by Lieut, Wilson on July 7th.
