

TO MAKE ALL GERMANS

Liable to Physical Exercise Before Joining Army.

The German Imperial Committee for Olympic games, after consultation with all the affiliated sports associations, is trying to promote a bill which would make every German who is liable to military service liable also to "regular physical exercise" up to the time of his entry into army or navy. There would be an elaborate scheme of official control, with powers of punishment placed in the hands of teachers and trainers. The minimum weekly exercise, of which the victims would take their choice, are specified as follows: One and a half hours of marching, foctball or hockey; three hours of gymnatistic exercises; one hour of running, skating or skiing; three hours of walking, or swimming; one and a half hours of cycling or rowing, or one hour of wrestling or boxing.


