HON. ALBERT SEVERYN. Ottawa, July 22.—Hon. Albert Severyn, Speaker of the House of Commons, is taking an officer's training course, will enlist as soon as qualified, assist in recruiting in Quebec, and hopes to go overseas on active service.

SPECIAL MOBILIZATION. Ukase for Construction of Defensive Works and Supports.

Petrograd, via London, July 22.—An Imperial ukase orders a special mobilization for the construction of defensive works and lines of communication in the region of the active armies of the whole male native population of the Province of Astrakhan, Siberia, the Island of Sakhalin and Turkestan.—The order includes males from 19 to 43 years. The Nomad populations are specially excepted.

ASTOUNDING DISCOVERY. Horned Men's Skulls Are Found in Rellies.

Athens, Pa., July 22.—The archaeologists who are traversing the Susquehanna river to the bay visiting sites of Indian villages and digging up the bones of aborigines are said to have made a most astounding discovery on the Murray farm, near here, in finding the bones of sixty-eight prehistoric men.

The average height of these men, when their skeletons were assembled, was seven feet, while many were much taller. Additional evidence of their gigantic size is found in the massive stone battle-axes in their graves. The average age of these men is said to have been from 30 to 40.

Another amazing point of this discovery is the allegation that "perfectly formed skulls were found from which horns grew straight out from the head."

The Fort Garry Horse was engaged in the recent cavalry action on the British front, when British cavalry had an opportunity for the first time since the action at Mons of showing their ability.

HAS RELEASED VESSEL. A British Steamer Was Taken in Swedish Waters. (Special to the Whig.)

Berlin, July 22.—The German authorities have ordered the release of the British steamer Adam, captured by a German torpedo boat, since an investigation disclosed the vessel was captured within Swedish territorial waters.
