

If such a thing came to pass, the result would be most disastrous. But the German menace must be forever removed, and German arrogance, which had increased continuously since the Franco-Prussian war, must be everlastingly humbled.

Canada had done splendidly in the great fight for liberty, pouring out men and money with marvellous liberality. But something more was needed if liberty was to be successfully defended and perpetuated-a constitution of strong, pure charac-
