

WHY BREAD AND MILK ARE COSTING SO MUCH.

Bakers and Milkmen Give Reasons-Scarcity of Labor Big Factor.

Inquiries prompted by the recent "kick" by the Trades and Labor Council against the high prices of bread and milk elicted the information from the bakers and the milkmen that the prices were as low as they could be if they were to keep

out of bankruptcy. The reason given by the bakers for bread selling at seven cents a loaf was the big advance in the price of flour and in the price of flour was about \$2 a barrel dearer than it was a year ago, while there had been a corresponding increase in the wages commanded by bakers. One sead manufacturer informed the Whig that he was paying nearly \$1,-500 more for the same number of men than he paid last year.
