TURNING PART OF WAR PASSED.

Paris, Aug. 7.—Gen. Joffre expressed the view that the turning point of the great conflict has now been successfully reached and passed, and that with the united action of the Entente Allies on the many fronts they are pressing forward to the certain collapse of the German efforts and to an assured victory for the Allies' armies.

WHY BREAD AND MILK ARE COSTING SO MUCH. Bakers and Milkmen Give Reasons—Scarcity of Labor Big Factor.

Inquiries prompted by the recent "kick" by the Trades and Labor Council against the high prices of bread and milk elicited the information from the bakers and the milkmen that the prices were as low as they could be if they were to keep out of bankruptcy.

The reason given by the bakers for bread selling at seven cents a loaf was the big advance in the price of flour and in the price of sugar was about \$2 a barrel dearer than it was a year ago, while there had been a corresponding increase in the wages commanded by bakers. One bread manufacturer informed the Whig that he was paying nearly \$1,500 more for the same number of men than he paid last year.

The flour men, this baker pointed out, were the ones to get after. Flour was constantly on the rise, having increased \$1 a barrel in the past two weeks.

A milkman gave various reasons for milk selling at eight cents a quart this summer instead of the usual seven. Some of the reasons were: High cost of living, which affected the milkman as well as the consumer; scarcity of labor, which meant increased wages; dear fodder and lastly the high price of cheese, which caused an increasing number of farmers to turn their milk into cheese.
