DOGS SO LENIENTLY.

He Made an Offer to Fight All Com- The Death of Allan Robinson Has Stirred the People - Kingston Needs an Effective Dog By-law.

There is great indignation throughout the city over the lack protection given the people against the dog nuisance. The death of Allan Robinson of the Bell Telephone Company's staff, as the result of being bitten on the arm last Friday night while trying to stop a dog fight on King street west, has roused the people to demand that the City Council put into effect a by-law that will keep dogs off the streets. Other cities like Ottawa have solved the dog nuisance question, which the Whig on many occasions has brought forcibly to the attention of the city fathers, but up to the present time Kingston has no effective dog by-law.
