Three cars took fire in getting out of the burned area, but the inhabitants fought the flames as best they could until the engine driver could tearhart, where after a few hours rest, be shown. Mr. Bates again returned to Matheson, or as near as he could get, for the line in the meantime had been destroyed, the ties being burned and the rails twisted.

Their narrowest escape was in leaving the burning station when they did, for a few minutes after the freight shed containing the dynamite blew up. In Matheson, alone,

over 125 people perished.

War Office Sends Anti-Aircraft Gun
