NO WORD HAS COME FROM THE DEUTSCHLAND Since She Left the Virginia Capes Fourteen Days Ago.

(Special to the Whig) London, Aug. 16.—The German merchant submarine Deutschland has not been heard from since she cleared the Virginia Capes on the night of August 2nd.

Sixteen days were required for the Deutschland to cross the Atlantic on her trip to Baltimore.

The fact that fourteen days have elapsed and she has not been heard from indicates that she has been compelled to take a round-about course to avoid British and French warships.

Persian Cabinet Falls. Washington, Aug. 16.—The fall of the Persian ministry was announced in a brief state department despatch which said that former Foreign Minister Wassough-El-Dau-Leh had been ordered to organize a new ministry.

Official and diplomatists are at a loss for an explanation of the despatch, as it was thought that recent Anglo-Russian agreement with Persia has removed the main causes of friction.
