fajor F. W. Partridge Pays Tribute To the Men Who Have Been Facing German Guns-Many Wounded Men Go Back to Firing Line. Major F. W. Partridge, who is at

letter to his parents, in this city, the following are extracts:

across the border to France again I have a large company in this new battalion, which is composed of men. many of whom have been fighting in the trenches, but were wounded, and are now going forward again. They are all new to me. I have been on the move ever since arriving in England, and have not had a word yet from Canada.

The crops in Belgium are good. The houses here are just like you back of the lines. We have been faring rough lately, living on poor Government's fault, but now I am much better off, having a soft bed

that it will soon be over. It seems to me that it is the arm-chair critics who are the fiercest people. Every man in the trenches is a hero, and anyone who faces those guns deserves all the nation can give.

The "contemptible little army" is more than holding its own. Don't let the people home get impatient to save life it is best to wear the Germans out and make them attack, for the guns are awful. Of course, our great stock of munitions is going to count and with them we will gain. step by step, until the whole thingcrumbles up, which will happen all

of a sudden I think. It is cold at night but hot in the day time. The guns shake the buildings and aeroplanes are flying past by the dozen. There is a fight on every evening. It looks fine to see them going by in a bunch. I counted seventeen at once,-one night, and they seem to be just like a flock of birds. Brave fellows in them I tell you. I saw Capt, William Harty, jr. go by last night, he looked fine, but I have seen no other Kingstonians since I came to France.




