Athens, (via London), Sept. 4 .-Representatives at Athens of Great Britain and France Sunday evening presented to the Government a note demanding control over the Greek posts and telegraphs and insisting on the deportation from Greece of agents of the Central powers. . The harbor of Piraeus has been practically taken over by the Allied fleet. The wireless station, the only means by which Greece can communicate with the outside world, has been seized by a landing force from the warships. The harbor was dragged and submarine nets laid, with the result that a German submarine was captured or sunk. It is believed this under-sea boat received supplies of oil and ammunition from the interned German liners, which were seized yesterday.
