MISSION WORK IN AFRICA

SOME OF ITS DANGERS AND ITS DIFFICULTIES.

Interesting Address by Commissioner Richards in S. A. Citadel—Successful Meetings Saturday and Sunday—Forty Recruits Secured.

A thrilling story of the missionary work of the Salvation Army in South Africa was related by Commissioner Richards in the Citadel Sunday afternoon to an audience that completely filled the building.

The Difficulties.

The Commissioner, in the first part of his address, told of some of the difficulties of missionary work in Africa. One of the greatest was witchcraft.

Too Many Wives.

Another of the difficulties resulted from the law which allowed a man to have as many wives as he desired. Reference was made to one man who had only forty-two wives and 175 children.

Teaching Farming.

The Salvation Army was showing the natives how they might till their land without using their wives. Nine farms had been established in the interior. On these farms could be found horses, oxen, well-bred cattle, such as Ayrshires and Holsteins.

Some of the Dangers.

The speaker told of some of the dangers of mission work. Wild beasts, which abounded, savage men, and unexplored and desolate wastes, in which it was possible for one to lose one's way and die and go mad were some of the dangers.

The speaker emphatically declared that missionary work paid. He told of a native worker who had converted among many others a man who for years had been regarded as mad, and three men who had served a term in prison for participating in the death of an aged woman in order that her husband might die because the ground might produce good crops.
