### SUPPLYING THE SOLDIERS

WORK OF SUPPLY COLUMN AT FRONT DESCRIBED.

Pte. Purcell Amey Says About 250 Tons of Provisions are Needed Each Day For First Canadian Division.

Pte. Purcell Amey, who went overseas with the first Canadian Division Supply Company in the early part of 1915, is in the city visiting his mother, Mrs. Capitola Amey, Earl street, formerly of Hicknell's Corners. Pte. Amey left the service on August 21st, and since then spent a short time in a hospital in France, suffering from bronchial trouble. He crossed from Havre to Shrotonlife, where he spent two weeks, proceeding to Liverpool, whence he sailed on the Missanable. The journey across was uneventful.

In speaking to The Whig of the work of the supply column, Pte. Amey said it was for the purpose of keeping man and beast supplied with food. The work of his column was to supply the first division, and about 250 tons of provisions were required a day. Delivery was made by seventy motor trucks. The strength of the first column was 380. Their quarters were located six or eight miles from the firing line. They had been singularly fortunate in that the enemy's guns had been unable to locate them. Occasionally an aeroplane would drop bombs near the park, but none ever succeeded in doing any material damage.

Asked what was the opinion of the soldiers at the front regarding the termination of the war, Pte. Amey said that the majority were convinced that the war would go at least another year, while some were predicting that it would last five years longer.

After visiting his mother Pte. Amey will return to Calgary, where he enlisted.

### BUSY YEAR FOR HOSPITAL MINISTERIAL ASSOCIATION

FINANCIAL REPORT OF THE GENERAL IS SATISFACTORY.

Five Nurses Recover From Typhoid—Visiting Governors Re-appointed, as They Failed to Make a Report.

The Board of Governors of Kingston General Hospital met on Monday afternoon, the following being present: A. F. Chown (chairman), R. E. Kent, T. McK. Robertson, James A. Minnes, W. H. Macnee, James Berney, W. B. Dalton and Rev. D. Laine.

This being the close of the financial year, considerable interest was taken in the reports presented, particularly the financial report. The past year has in every respect been an unusual one. The presence of so many soldiers in the city has taxed the hospital accommodation to its utmost, and on that account both the receipts and expenditures were very much beyond normal. The report was considered satisfactory.

The committee of management brought in its usual monthly report, mentioning quite a number of things that had been undertaken during the month, and mentioned the difficulty in getting repairs and improvements done on account of the scarcity of workmen in all branches of trade.

One of the pleasing features in their report was the announcement that the five nurses previously reported ill with typhoid fever had all recovered and were now on leave of absence at their homes.

Several very important improvements are under consideration by the committee of management and were discussed.

The medical superintendent, Dr. Boyd, was present and brought in his report. Through ill-health he had not been on duty for a few weeks, but is now on a fair way to recovery. A resolution of sympathy was passed for Miss Boskill, superintendent of the training school for nurses, who lately has been bereaved by the death of her mother.

The visiting governors appointed for last month, W. J. Fee and William Jackson, not having brought in a report, were re-appointed.

**Funeral of J. R. Johnston.**  
The funeral of John R. Johnston took place Tuesday afternoon from the family residence, 298 University avenue, to Cemetery, and was largely attended. Rev. Alfred Brown, pastor of Sydenham Street Methodist church, officiated. The pallbearers were: Charles G. Johnston, Copper Cliff, a son of the deceased; A. C. and J. S. Johnston, brothers; H. J. Johnston, son-in-law; W. D. Johnston, cousin, and James Dunlop, Kingston. The floral tributes were many and very beautiful.
