



Materials-2 cups flour. 2 teaspoons baking powder, 2 teaspoons shortening, 1/2 teaspoon salt, 1/2 cup currants.

Utensils-Mixing bowl, flour sifter, two measuring cups, teaspoon, tablespoon, bakeboard, rolling pin, biscuit cutter, bakepan, pastry brush.

Directions-Sift the flour, baking powder and salt into bowl; add shortening and rub in very lightly with the tips of the fingers; then add the currants and mix well. Roll or flatten out with hands on floured bakeboard I inch thick; cut with biscuit cutter. Place on bakepan; brush top with milk and bake 12 to 15


