BOARD OF WORKS PLEASED
WITH THE ASPHALT ROAD PAVING ON UNIVERSITY AVENUE.
Howard S. Dick Appointed Assistant City Engineer—Hedge on City Property Must Be Removed.
The members of the Board of Works, who met yesterday afternoon for the first time since sunrise, expressed themselves as highly pleased with the asphalt paving so far done on University avenue. The city's new plant is giving good service, and the work being done is of the best. The City Engineer stated that next spring every inch of the boulevard in readiness to proceed with what ever further road paving the Board might direct. The boulevard in the centre of the University avenue roadway along the university grounds is to be turned over to the Parks' Committee.
On recommendation of the City Engineer, Howard S. Dick was appointed assistant engineer at a salary of \$1,000 a year. Mr. Dick has been in charge of the road paving plant this season. The engineer and his assistant will do all the inside clerical work of the office during the winter, going away with the employment of a clerk. Until the road work is completed M. E. Marsh has been engaged as temporary clerk in the engineer's office.
The Board granted the petition of residents of lower Union street, asking that the hedge and wire fence at the corner of Wellington and Union streets be removed, as it is on city property and obstructs their view. A recommendation will be made to the City Council that the hedge be removed.
In attendance at the meeting were Alds. Peters (chairman), Litton, Hughes and White.

STOLE SUIT TWICE AND SOLD IT ONCE
Sneak Thief Has Been Working Overtime in the City of Late.

ASK CONTRIBUTIONS FROM THE WOMEN
Towards the Duchess of Connaught's Canadian Prisoners of War Fund.

Letters have just been received by Miss A. S. M. Machar, President of the Local Council of Women, from the National Council of Women, and from the vice-President of Ontario, also from the wife of the Lieutenant-Governor, inviting the Kingston Council to join with the other councils of Ontario, in promoting the parting gift to H.R.H. (The Honorary President of the National Council), which is, at her request, to take form of "A Prisoner of War Fund" for the Canadian soldiers who fall into the hands of the enemy. The following extracts from Mrs. Cumming's letter will be read with interest by all members of the local council, i.e., all the members of its federated societies:
"The President wishes me to write to the Local Councils to invite their loyal co-operation in the matter of the farewell gift to our Honorary President, H.R.H. the Duchess of Connaught, which, as you doubtless know, is to take the form of a contribution to the Duchess of Connaught's prisoners of war fund for the Canadian soldiers who fall into the hands of the enemy. The particular manner in which the gift will be raised will be arranged in each province under the leadership of the wife of the Lieutenant-Governor, but the president asks me to say that she hopes every Local Council will make a special effort at once to help to make the contributions from the National Council expressive of our appreciation of the many kindnesses we have received from Her Royal Highness, and worthy of the Council itself, and of the cause to which the money will go. May I suggest that you arrange for a central place where contributions may be received by your treasurer, or some one in her place?"
In accordance with the above request, the members of all societies federated with the Local Council, are invited to send any contributions they may think proper to give, to the treasurer, Mrs. W. G. Jordan, 116 Barrie street, before Thursday, October 12th, on which date the list will be closed.
