SAILORS' RELIEF FUND.

M. P. Fennell, Jr., of Montreal, Will Speak on Subject To-night.

Kington has an interesting visitor in the city to-day, in the person of M. P. Fennell, Jr., honorary secretary of the British Sailors' Relief Fund.

Mr. Fennell is organizing branches of the Sailors' Relief Fund which has been established to show the appreciation Canada has for the part the sailors of the British navy have been taking in the great struggle, and to have a fund that will help disabled and wounded sailors, and also to assist the widows and orphans of seamen who have made the supreme sacrifice.

Mr. Fennell is secretary of the Harbor Commission at Montreal, has organized branches of the fund in every city between the Atlantic and Edmonton.
