RED SOX OUTFIT HAS THE ADVANTAGE Boston Possesses Age and Experience as Best Assets —Dodgers Powerful.

Statistics of the Brooklyn National League Club, which will oppose the Boston American in the world's series beginning on Saturday, show that the average age of the Brooklyn players is 27 1-3 years, while that of the Boston combination is 27 1/2 years. Although the Boston team has the advantage of age and experience, the Brooklyn squad is heavier and taller. The average weight of the Brooklyn players is 178 pounds, and the height an even six feet.

Of the Brooklyn pitching staff, Pfeffer, Coombs, Cheney, Dell and Appleton have a right hand delivery, while the other four, Rucker, Marquard, Mails and Smith are south-paws.

Umpires Have Been Appointed For the Big Baseball Battle. There was quite a little surprise at the names of the umpires assigned to the series. The National League selected O'Day and Quigley, while Dineen and Connolly were the choice of Ban Johnson. This is the first world's series in which Bill Klem will not officiate, and his absence will be regretted, as he generally is regarded as the nearest thing to a perfect umpire in the game.

A peculiar coincidence is that Connolly and O'Day were the umpires in the first world's series played between the National and American Leagues in 1903, when the Red Sox defeated Pittsburg. Bill Dineen, who will be coupled up with Connolly this fall, pitched Boston to three victories in the 1903 series.

Chairman Herrmann announced that the charge for Braves' field, the home of the Boston Nationals, will be \$1,000 a day, which will be shared equally by the contestants. It was suggested to President Ebbets of Brooklyn that he play on the Polo Grounds, but he said he would not leave Brooklyn for \$50,000.

The National Commission issued the usual warning to the public not to deal with ticket scalpers. The warning follows: "The public is cautioned against paying higher prices for admission than those fixed in the commission's bulletin. The commission has the assurance of hearty cooperation from municipal authorities of each city in the suppression of ticket scalping."

CANADIAN HORSES WON.

Sir Adam Beck's Stable Successful at Philadelphia.

In the recent horse show at Philadelphia, at which the best show horses in the United States competed, the thoroughbreds owned by Sir Adam Beck, of London, Ont., made an excellent showing in the class for ladies' novice hunters, for horse which had never won a first prize or a second prize in any recognized show. Sir Adam's Falmouth, ch.g., was second. In the class for hunters and jumpers, open to all, Sir Adam's Melrose, b.g., won first prize. In the class for hunters and jumpers open to green hunters only Melbourne owned by the Londoner, was third. During their stay in Philadelphia, Sir Adam and Lady Beck were the guests of Mr. and Mrs. Herbert Lloyd at their country place, Bod-Llywd, Bryan Mawr.

MOST SPECTACULAR RACE

Ever Witnessed in the National Baseball League.

The race just over was one of the most spectacular ever seen in the National League, an organization noted for its close finishes. Brooklyn, the pennant winner, held the lead for five months in a season fairly sizzling in its warmth of playing. Pounding down the stretch from May to Oct., the leaders were never in a position to relax for a moment. In every game there was a possibility. Injuries beset the Dodgers, and Pfeffer, their star pitcher, suffered a reversal of form. The Dodgers started on a long road trip and were rudely bumped out of the top position, only to return home and again push away opposition. No less than three clubs were in the hunt right up to the final week. Not since 1908, when the Cubs and Giants went into a play-off series, has such a close finish been witnessed.

"FIGHTING JACK" MUNRO.

Miner, Boxer and ex-Mayor Now in English Hospital.

The "punch" of Private John Munro of the Princess Pats—big "Jack" Munro, B.C. miner, Ontario prospector, and heavyweight boxer; ex-mayor of Elk City, and the man who fought Sharkey, Jim Jeffries and Johnson, respectively, in June and August, 1902, and June, 1904—after seven months at the front has gone for ever. Over a year ago Munro was wounded at Armentieres and has been undergoing hospital treatment ever since. At the present

time he is a patient at the Granville Canadian special hospital, Ramsgate.

The bullet which struck him in the upper right chest would have killed an average man. That he survived was entirely due to his enormous shoulder muscles, but ever since he was wounded his arm has been partially paralyzed. Whether he will ever again regain its complete use cannot yet be said.
