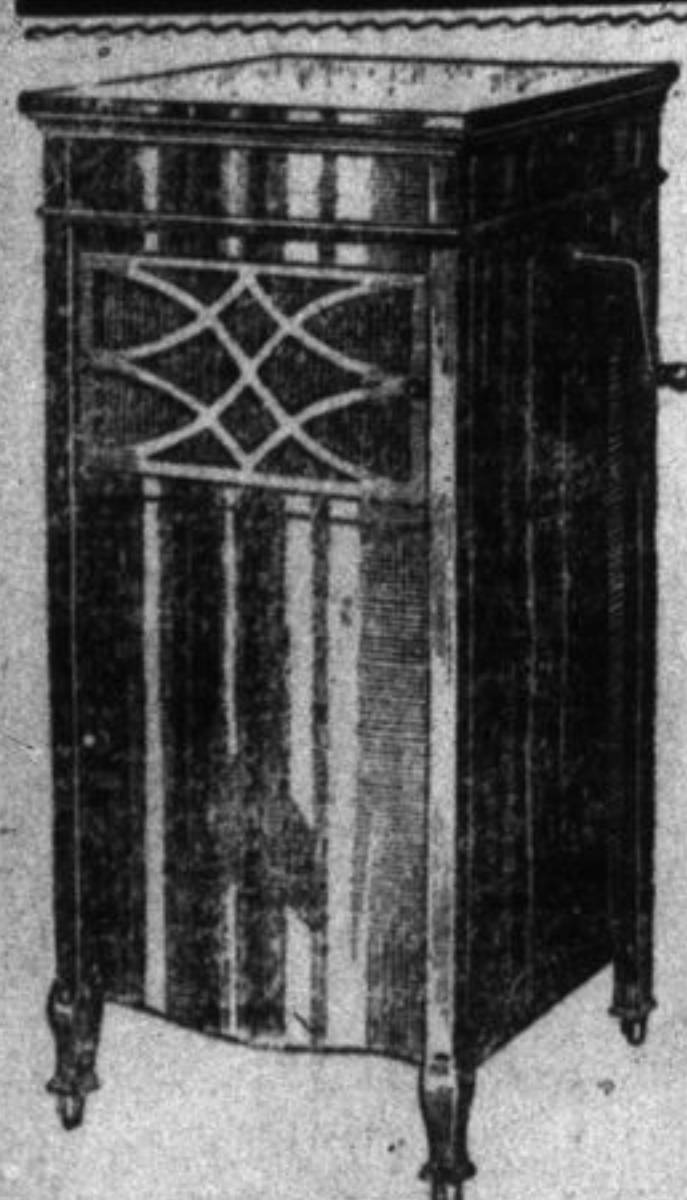

A PERFECT BATTING MARK

GAINER AT BAT ONCE AND GOT A HIT.

Lewis and Hooper Led Red Sox Attack, and Stengel Was Best Batter on the Brooklyn Team.

Del Gainer, substitute player of the Boston Red Sox, with a perfect mark of 1,000 was the batting leader in the world's series, according to official averages issued.

The real leader, however, is outfielder Lewis of the Sox, who played in all the games, and wound up with an average at the bat of .353.

Excellent on Defence. The splendid defensive play of the entire Boston team also counted in the victory.

On the other hand Brooklyn made fourteen errors that had the misfortune to make them when they did the most harm.
