Canada Third Best Customer

Washington, Oct. 27.—Canada's imports from the United States for the first eight months of the calendar year, according to official statistics totalled \$373,736,569, an increase of \$163,000,000 over the corresponding period of last year.

The largest gain shown by the figures was in exports to the United Kingdom, which took nearly one-third of all goods exported from the United States in that period.
