

New York. Oct. 27 .- Declination of Henry Clay Frick to stand for reelection as a director of the Philadelphia and Reading Railway Company and the Reading Coal and Iron Company at the annual meetings is interpreted as marking the beginning of the time of Mr. Frick's voluntary retirement from active participation in the affairs of many corporations. He is approaching the threescore and ten mark, and has had an active career ever since he assumed the presidency in 1881 of the coke company organized by him and his associates and which is now the largest producer of that commodity. Mr. Frick retains his Reading Company directorship, which is one of a list of nine companies, including the United States Steel Corporation, Pennsylvania Railroad, Norfolk and Western, Atchison, and Chicago and North-


