She will look after the interests of women factory workers and deal with the question of wages, labor conditions, etc.

Copenhagen, Oct. 31.—Indications of the seriousness of the Norwegian-German submarine issue came today when reports reached here that the Norwegian minister to Berlin had arrived in Christiania. He made the trip presumably to discuss the situation before the Government sends Norway's reply to Germany's sharp protest against the decree forbidding Norwegian ports and waters to Teuton submarines.
