Heavy Losses in Cherry Orchards. The losses in Ontario cherry orchards as a result of leaf spot are proving quite as great as indicated by special reports published last summer. The disease began to be serious last season, and as a result over 1,400 young trees in one Norfolk county orchard and 400 in another orchard in Prince Edward county were dead this spring, while complaints of smaller losses were all too frequent. More will be found dead next spring.
