ARE CONSOLIDATING. (Special to the Whig.) London, Nov. 2.—British troops are engaged in consolidating their positions at the Macedonian town of Barakli. Djums, captured from the Bulgars on Tuesday. British warships have bombarded the enemy positions at Nechori. On the Doiran front only artillery engaged yesterday.

THIRTEENTH CENTURY METHODS WERE USED Hurling Tree Trunks Down Into Valleys and Barred Any Advance. (Special to the Whig.) London, Nov. 2.—The Russo-Rumanians who bar the way to Bucharest are still holding their front. Thirteenth century methods of warfare were used by them in winning their victory over the Germans near the Vulcan Pass. The Rumanians first attacked the German front in considerable force. As the Teutons began to retreat the Rumanian detachments stationed on the heights of the narrow valley hurled tree trunks down the sides, barring the progress of both infantry and artillery.

SENATOR MACDONALD DEAD Entered the Red Chamber in 1871—One of B. C. Senators. Montreal, Nov. 2.—The Gazette announces the death on October 25th of Hon. William John MacDonal, one of the founders of Victoria, B. C., and one of the last survivors of the fast-diminishing number of British Columbia pioneers who helped to shape the destinies of the province. The late Mr. MacDonal was born in Scotland in November, 1832, and was called to the Senate when British Columbia entered Confederation in 1871.

ASKS AID FOR THRESHERS. Premier Martin Says Labor Shortage is Serious.

Regina, Nov. 2.—Premier Martin has issued a statement to the people of Saskatchewan urging "every physically fit man or boy who can possibly do so to volunteer to help man the threshing machines, many of which will otherwise be idle." The Premier says that not over one-third of the threshing in the province is done, and that there "is a very serious situation to cope with" since the labor shortage is acute.

CANADIAN TROOPS MOVE.

Majority of Them Taking Rest on the Loos Sector. Ottawa, Nov. 2.—Cable advices report that most of the Canadian troops have now been moved off of the Somme front, after several weeks of hard fighting, and have been given positions in the Loos sector, to the north.

Major Baron Lisagatock has died of wounds received in action. He was born in 1870, and held the posts of High Sheriff and Mayor of Montreal. The Michigan Central Railroad has just closed contracts for the construction of 8,750 freight cars at an aggregate cost of \$9,000,000.
