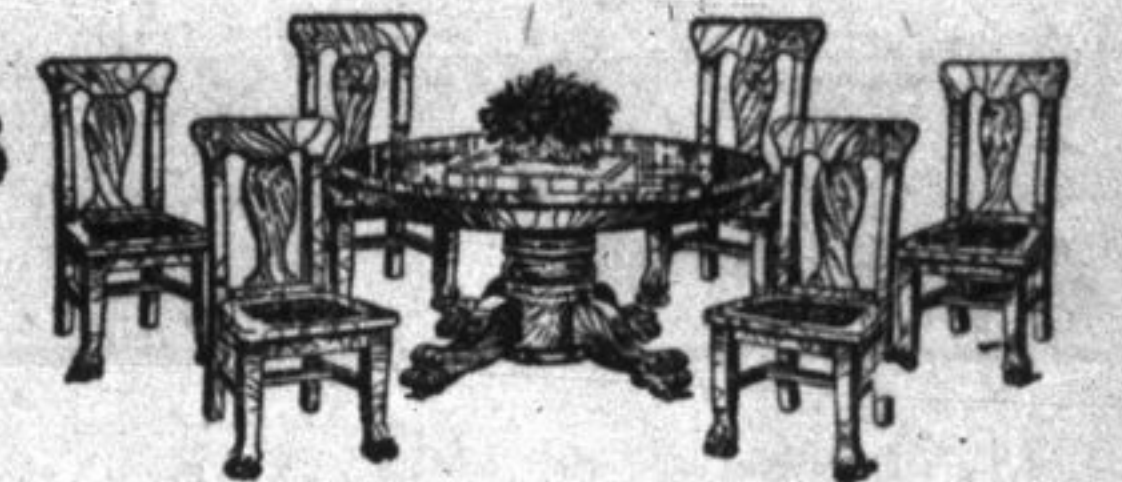

**European War in Light of Prophecy.**

Every nation had armed itself to guarantee peace, and then the forces of destruction were turned loose upon the world. Millions of men sprang to arms, and arms were ready. Men forgot that they armed to guarantee peace, and they began to fight one another with all fury and to die like herds of cattle driven to slaughter.
