LIVELY BATTLE ON THE SOMME

Vividly Described By a Kingston Officer Who Took Part.

SAW THE WHOLE BATTLE

FROM HIS OBSERVATION POST AND TELLS ALL ABOUT IT.

The Most Thrilling Day He Had for a Long Time—British in Complete Control of Situation From First to Last.

The following vivid description of a battle on the Somme is by a Kingston officer, who was an eye-witness on October 22nd:

Yesterday I had the finest and most exhilarating sight I've had since I came to France. I saw from my observation post the whole of the battle of the Somme in miniature...

Take it all round, it was the most thrilling day I've had since I saw the gallant Sikhs and Gurkhas of the Lahore division make their gallant but hopeless charge before St. Jean in April of last year.

My point of observation was splendid in a second line trench on rising ground; in fact, it was such a good observation post that the Boche seemed at times to devote too much attention to it and once we moved along the trench a few yards to quieter quarters.

Attack at Noon.

The attack was at six minutes past twelve o'clock noon, and we were checking our lines and ranges for our barrage practically up to that time.

Prompt on the minute named the barrage opened up—chiefly of course 18-pounders, which fire almost all the shrapnel used by British artillery.

Within thirty seconds of the time the barrage commenced our infantry were "over the top" and moving across No Man's Land, which varied in width between two hundred and four hundred yards.

How foolish, you may think, just impudent bravado. But no, they were doing just the right thing. They strolled, because that was just the right pace to enable them to keep close to our barrage, the great secret

How Germans Direct Fire.

Fortunately to-day the barrage is good and the Germans, though their artillery opens quickly, seem to direct it more on our reserve and support trenches.

The smoke is still thick, but through it one can see a lot of our people streaming back. For a moment I thought I must be wrong; they're beaten off after all—and then I noticed that none had rifles, and thought, "No, it must be the wounded; what a lot there are."

A moment or two more and we see some different figures—some crawling along, crouching in the shell-holes, scuttling like rabbits, with hands held up. These are the prisoners coming out in groups, and singly. It is amazing to notice the effect on the two sides, of the event of the moment.

But for the moment we are successful. Perhaps yesterday it was different; to-morrow may be again. But for the moment our tails are at the Boche's down, and the result was extraordinary. Our men were strolling about "No Man's Land," by this time fairly steadily shelled by the Germans, paying no more attention to the shells than they were peas from so many pea-shooters.

Amusing Incidents. One amusing incident I saw—one of our chaps, his stature exaggerated by the smoke, till he seemed to be a Colossus, standing unconcernedly in the middle of "No Man's Land," as it had been, directing a stream of German prisoners where to go, like a policeman directing the traffic.

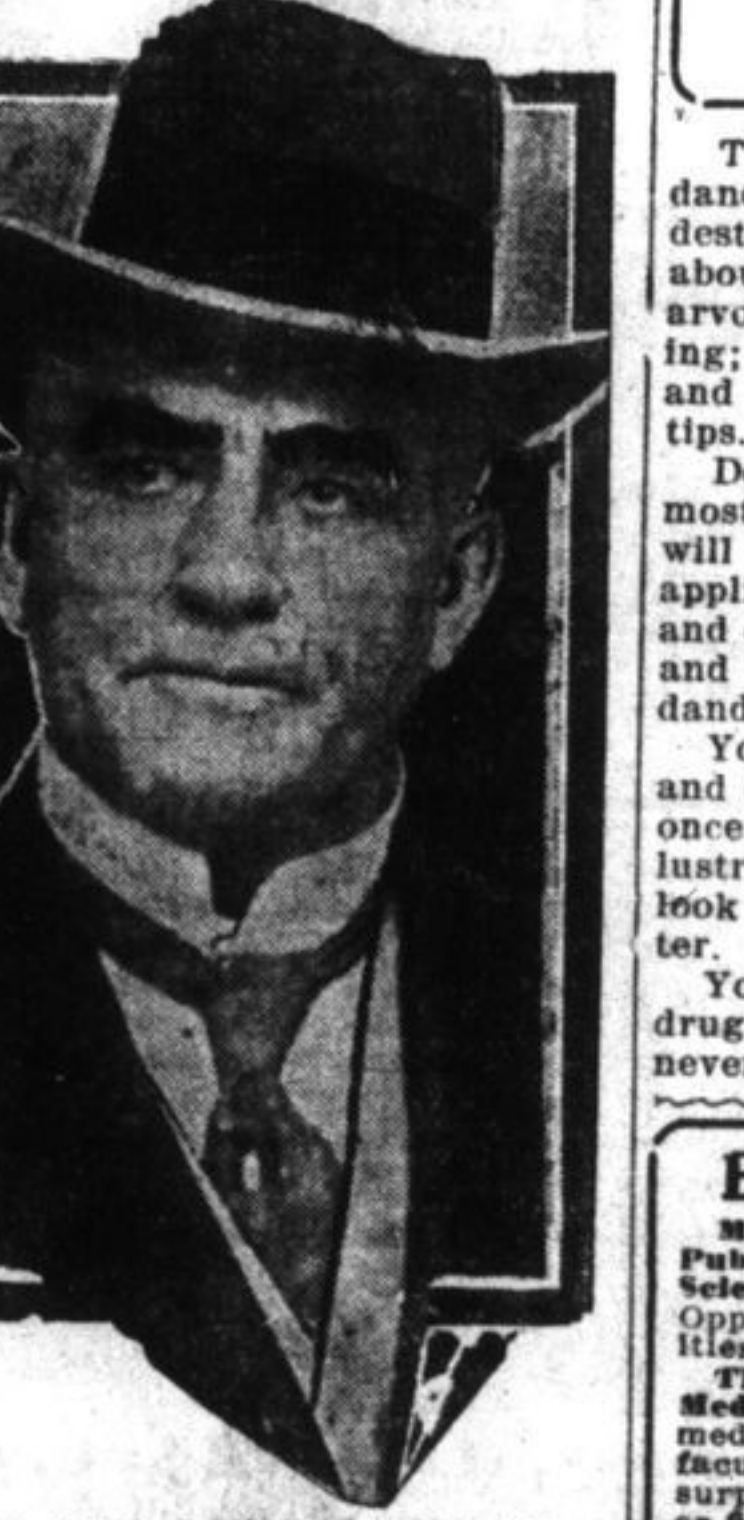
