D. S. O. WON BY A HASTINGS BOY Major Roscoe Vandewater Decorated for Bravery - Recommended for Cross.

Belleville, Nov. 16. - The first Hastings officer to receive the Distinguished Service Order is Major Roscoe Vandewater, of the 2nd Battalion, formerly of the 89th. The announcement of his decoration says he "commanded an attacking party with great determination, held and consolidated the captured trench, and personally supervised the digging of new communication trenches."

Major Vandewater, D.S.O., bears the distinction of also being recommended for the Military Cross for special gallantry and coolness on the afternoon of 26th April, 1916, when his mine was exploded under his trench and he took charge and directed the company. He and once had rapid fire opened on the enemy and prevented them from crossing and occupying the crater and by his example stimulated the men.

He is a former 49th Battalion officer and a son of Charles Vandewater, ex-deputy reeve of Sidney.

The Canadian Arctic explorer, Vilhjalmur Stefansson, now in the Far North and just heard from, reviews the work of his expedition up to Jan. 15th, 1916, and expresses disappointment that the survey and exploration work was delayed and must wait until 1917.
