

PHOTOGRAPHER RISKS HIS LIFE TO SECURE THIS PHOTOGRAPH OF THE SUBMARINE DEUTSCHLAND. An interesting story is attached to this picture of the submarine Deutschland, taken after the vessel's recent arrival at New London. It shows the submersible protected on three sides by a high board fence at the specially-constructed dock. The photographer eluded the watchman and gained access to the enclosure. While he was taking the picture from a platfrom which he reached by means of a canoe, he was discovered and a plank weighing several hundred pounds was hurled at him from the deck of the s.s. Willehad, which is the mother ship of the Deutschland. In the lower right hand corner, the picture shows the last of the ripples made by the plank striking the water.
