THIS DISTRICT HAS ALREADY RECRUITED 39,579 MEN

The Command of Brig-Gen. T. D. R. Hemming, G. O. C., Has Made a Very Enviable Record.

The latest recruiting return is sued at headquarters here shows hat a grand total of 39,579 men have been enlisted in this military district since the war broke out There exists in military circles the widest difference of opinion as to what this district's quota of Canada's 500,000 is, but the Whig's figures are being used freely, and generally accepted as being as nearly correct as possible. The figures published a few weeks ago in the Whig were supplied by Lieut.-Col. Mulloy, who secured them in Ottawa at the first recruiting conference there some

Premier Borden on New Year's Dominion of Canada. That works out as thirteen per cent of the Dominion's population of 3,821,067 males, which is the figure of the last Dominion census. There were 310,-325 males in this military district at the same time. Thirteen per cent

Less than 1,000 men must come forward before that number will be reached here, but it is variously estimated that between 3,000 and 5,-000 men have left this district to enfist in units in Toronto, Montreal and other centres outside.

This subject has aroused a great amount of interest and more accurate figures are needed, but there seems to be no way of securing them until the national registration is taken during this winter.


