CASE AGAINST MINING CO.

Did Its Negligence Cause Fire on Albert C. Sills' Property?

Nearly ten hours were required to hear the case of Albert C. Sills vs. the Anglin-Mica Mining Company.

The evidence took up six hours and a half and argument by counsel three hours.

Judge Lavell reserved decision. This being the last case on the docket, the criminal court was declared closed.

Mr. Sills claimed \$500 for damages done by fire, alleged to have been negligently started by the defendants on May 15th, 1916, also \$100 for value of wood and timber cut, and asked for an injunction restraining the defendants from cutting timber on lot 10 in the 10th concession of Loughboro Township except for camp or mining purposes.

tempted to show that the fire, which swept over fifteen acres of land, touching 6,000 trees, was the result of a fire started by the defendants, but the defendants, while admitting they started a fire around the forge as a means of precaution, swore that the fire had been completely put out some hours before the other fire broke out.

Much contradictory evidence was given as to the damages suffered. Evidence was submitted by the defence to the effect that the damage was not very extensive, as many of the trees in the burned area were in leaf months after the fire. Witnesses for the plaintiff estimated that the land swept by the fire was worth from \$20 to \$30 an acre, while evidence given by the defence showed that similar land brought only \$8 and \$4 an acre.
