The year 1917 will be marked by greater earth dramas than ever before. In these Nature as well as Man will play a part. War probably will continue to lay waste to Europe until 1918, when peace may intervene some time

in the summer. The autumn Equinox will change the current of world affairs and bring grave responsibilities to the United States.

After March the President will find himself sustained by a unifying of public sentiment on international affairs. Events will bing into unusual prominence the Vice-President, who will be conspicuous in matters of

supreme moment to the country. Changes in the President's cabinet and in other high places may be startling and numerous. The first week of August, 1917, probably will mark a turn in sentiment concerning the war in Europ

"War will continue probably until 1918, although March, 1916, may bring strong hopes of peace." "The death of a high official (in Germany), possibly a member

of the royal family, is predicted." (Von Moltke died.)

"England may expect peril from air, raids February 8-7." Literally fulfilled on exact dates.)

"While the navy (English) may gain in June, losses are likely the middle of the month." (The Jutland battle was in June.)

"Holland has the forecast of much trouble and possible invasion. There is an ill omen for March."

(Holland massed troops on the German border March 31.)

"Sweden has a threatening time in January." (Mail seizures. Embargo on wood pulp, January 21.) "Although the United States begins the new year more blessed
