The Effect of War Upon Religion

On the contrary, there were the evidences that in their sore affliction the people turned to a Supreme Being for help, other comfort being denied them. Those who argued, rather than felt, that God was still in His Heaven, said that this war was evidence neither for nor against their belief. This war was merely sin on a grand scale. If its existence proved that there was no God, then the first crime, the murder of Abel, proved it. To say that if there were a God He never would have permitted the war was to say that if there were a God He never would have permitted crime nor suffering nor injustice nor any unkindness.
