

*************** GREECE YIELDED IN NICK OF TIME

Plans Were Perfected for Entire Destruction of the Hellenic Army.

Athens, Jan. 18 .- Nearly everyone in this city is much satisfied with the acceptance of the ultimatum. The king is undoubtedly thankful to have preserved his throne through a period of stress. He would probably have accepted any ultimatum rather than embark on an uncertain military adventure between the closing forces of Admiral Gaucher and Gen. Sarrail.

Sarrail, it is known, was sufficienty unembarrassed at the front to have forces and time to devote himself to the entire destruction of the Greek army. Nor was he unprepared for that end at the time the ultimatum was delivered.

All plans formed here for the eventual eatry of the Greek army into the campaign against us were based on the co-operation of the German troops when so favorably situ-ated that the Hellenic forces would only encounter the minimum of danger. Among political leaders, even Counaris, the arch-pro-German, counselled acceptance of the Allies demands. The only openly crestfallen people are those dilapidated statesmen who wished to be either actual or miral stipendiaries of Ger-
