Scotland for several years.



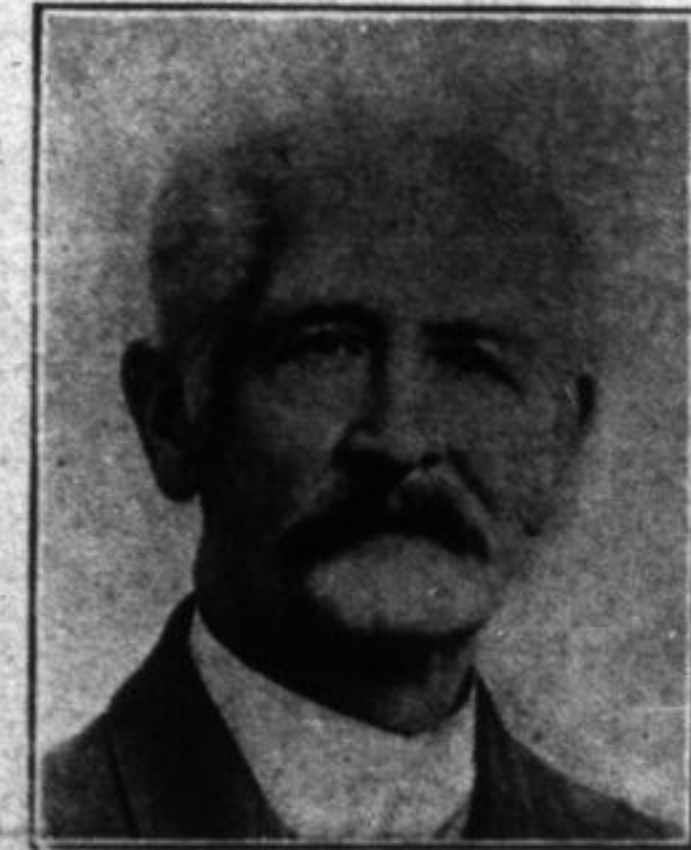

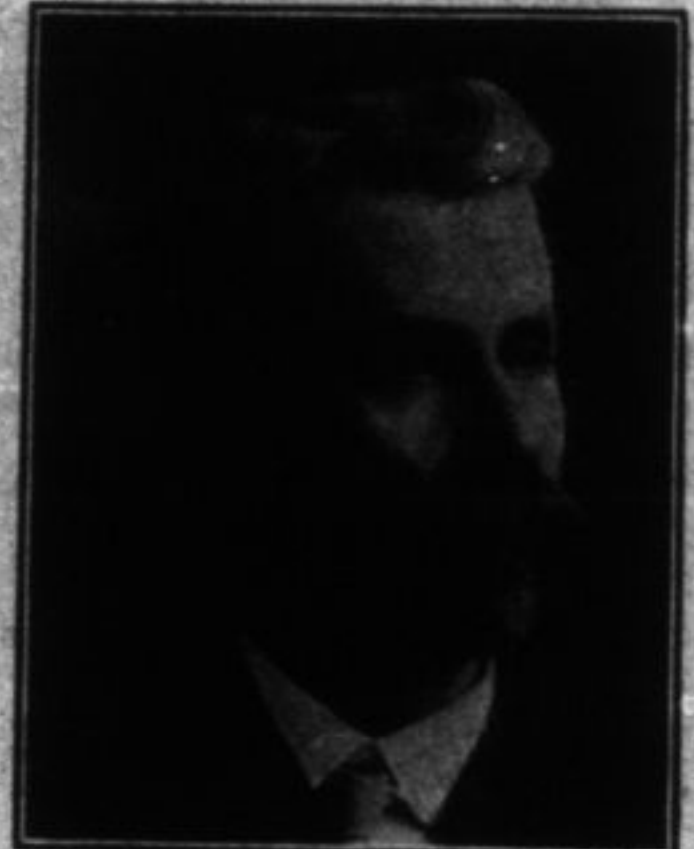

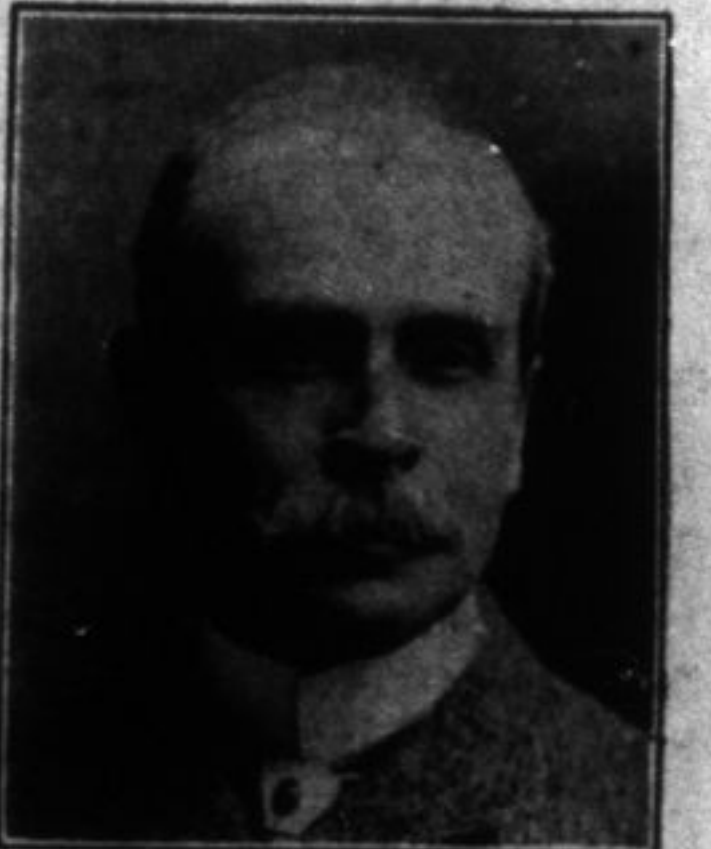
