RUSSIA ENDS CRUSADE CONSTANTINOPLE HAS LONG BEEN SLAV HOLY CITY.

Great Britain's Mistaken Support of the Turk Prevented the Slav Empire Securing an Ice-free Port Many Years Ago, but Russian Byzantium is Now Assured.

THE Russian Premier's announcement in the Duma of an agreement made with Great Britain, France, and Russia, in 1915, consented to by Italy afterward, establishing "in the most definite manner the right of Russia" to the Dardanelles and Constantinople, confirms officially what has long been rumored and believed.

In 1853, before the Crimean war, as in 1829 when the Russians got as far as Adrianople, his policy was fair. He was willing to let England have Egypt if Russia's position in the Black Sea was not endangered.

A saying of Napoleon's, or attributed to him, that Constantinople is "the key to the world," may have helped the growth of the British legend of the woes that would follow the creation of a Muscovite Constantinople.

It must be from 190 to 200 miles from the Dardanelles entrance to the Bosphorus across. In Russia to have the inland region up to the famous "Face-Middle line," 120 miles long, from Enos, over against Samothrace, to Midia on the Black Sea? Gallipoli peninsula, the coast of the Gulf of Saros, the Dardanelles passage, must be defended. And unless Russia is to occupy the Asiatic shore and hinterland, assault from that quarter must be guarded against.

BIRDS FLY AT NIGHT.

Thousands Migrate in the Darkness During Fall. It is difficult to believe that at times during the season of migration the sky at night is filled with birds from dusk until dawn.

The day flyers are hardy rovers which are used to the open and do not hesitate to venture far from cover. But the night flyers, writes Frank M. Chapman in The Travels of Birds, are the shy, retiring birds of thickets and undergrowth, which rarely go far from their own doorstep.

For several reasons, we know more about the travels of the night flyers than we do about those of the day flyers. First, because many more birds travel by night than by day; second, because practically all birds that fly by night are sea migrants; third, because the night flyers seem unable to avoid the lighthouses in their way.

By night as well as day our ears can tell us much about the number of birds that are passing overhead. Indeed, during nights when many birds are flying, we can, from favorable places, such as high hills, hear their call-notes almost constantly.

RAIDER WAS SIGHTED

Off Coast of Rio Grande Do Norte Last Thursday.

Rio de Janeiro, Jan. 22.—The first report indicating the general location of the German South Atlantic raider was received here Saturday. The Brazilian packet steamer Bahia reported she sighted a vessel believed to be the raider, off the coast of Rio Grande Do Norte on Thursday. The stranger was travelling north at a speed estimated at about 20 knots. No consort was sighted with her.

COMPLICATIONS NEARER.

Between United States and Germany Over Capture of Neutrals.

Washington, Jan. 22.—Danger of complications with Germany over marine problems seemed to authorities to-day to be nearer than for months past. Her capture of neutrals and making them prisoners on the steamer Yarrowdale; plus the strong trend of German sentiment toward wider submarine, made these possibilities more ominous.

Anxious to Escape Turks. Washington, Jan. 22.—More than 1,000 Americans have petitioned Ambassador Elkus at Constantinople to get them out of Syria and Palestine. The ambassador cables the State Department that the original estimate of 300 has more than tripled since the Turkish military representations accorded to strong representations by the State Department that American citizens be allowed to leave.
