

> PROHIBITION IN BRITAIN Is Practical, Bishop Perrin Writes in London Chronicle.

London, Jan. 31 .- Bishop Perrin of Willesden, formerly bishop of British Columbia, writing in the Chronicle on the question of prohipolitic, and points to what has been done in Canada, "Oh, yes, people say," Bishop Perrin writes, "but Canada is so different from England. My answer to that is: Have you been there-I do not mean on a trip for a month, but have you lived in Canada as I have for eighteen years? Prohibition was no easier there than at home, yet today from. Atlantic to the Pacific it has been accepted in every province, with the exception of Quebec, which is nearly dry, because the people have seen that the war demanded it. Every argument used here was used there, and far more strongly. The vested interests and all the rest of it said: "It can never be," but it has come to pass.
